Bakanowsky Receives Second Angler Of The Year Award

By virtue of two first-place finishes in the final two DRFA tournaments of the year, Phil Bakanowsky accumulated the highest point total among all anglers competing for the 2001 Dave Bryant Angler of the Year Award.

The award honors DRFA past-president David Bryant who passed away in 1999 at the age of 47. Anglers accumulate points throughout the year in accordance with their placement in the club's eight tournaments. All DRFA members are automatically eligible for these eight club events for

various species – shad, catfish, smallmouth bass, and largemouth bass. The winner of each club event earns 100 points toward the annual competition, with second place earning 99 points, 98 for third, and so on.

Bakanowsky earned 550 out of a possible 800 points to capture the annual competition by a margin of just 3 points on the final day of competition. His six fish caught during the 2001 season weighed a total of 16.57 lbs. and measured a combined 104.88 inches – an average of nearly 2-3/4 lbs. and 17-1/2” per fish. He edged out John Turgyan who along with angling partners George Hoffman and Chris Hoffman represented the only other anglers to break the 500-point barrier.

This is the second time in three seasons that Bakanowsky has earned Angler of the Year honors. For his accomplishment, he earned an engraved plaque and a \$200 cash award. His name will also be engraved on the permanent plaque for the Dave Bryant Angler of the Year Award.

Perseverance Marks Success For Angler Of The Year

The listings at the right represent the final standings of all DRFA members who weighed-in at least one legal fish during the 2001 tournament season.

Below is a summary of an interview conducted with 2001 Angler Of The Year, Phil Bakanowsky.

In the four years that Phil Bakanowsky has been a member of the Delaware River Fishermen's Association, his fishing interests have shifted away from saltwater and New Jersey freshwater lakes like Assunpink Lake, and more heavily onto the Delaware River. If results from the last three Angler of the Year competitions are any indication, his attention has certainly paid off. "I probably now spend about 90% of my fishing time on the river chasing largemouth bass," he notes. He'll also pursue some catfish, perch, and panfish throughout the year.

This past year, Phil earned his second of the three Dave Bryant Angler of the Year awards the club has presented. Part of his success is due to consistency. He missed weighing in a fish in only two of the club's eight tournaments. The other part is being in the right place at the right time, often due to advance scouting or planning.

"On the day of the smallmouth tournament, we were having trouble with our electric motor, so we ended up anchoring near several of the large boulders across the river from the Byram launch ramp," he says. "We fished live crayfish slowly and thoroughly around the backs of those boulders. I remembered talking to Pete Antoniewicz about smallies taking crayfish in that area of the river, so I spent Saturday afternoon driving up from South Jersey to

HL Live Bait and Tackle in Morrisville when I couldn't find any bait shops near home that carried crayfish." That strategy paid off for Phil in the form of a 3.31-lb. bronzeback that is by far the largest DRFA tournament smallmouth caught in recent years.

On the day of the final catfish tournament, Phil trailed John Turgyan by just two points in the Angler of the Year standings. Winning that tournament made the difference – by a total of just three points!

"Before the tournament, I had found a deep hole in the river that held big fish," Phil notes. "But on the day of the tournament it was so windy that we were forced into the Pennsauken Creek." Fortunately, Phil explores both the Pennsauken and Rancocas Creeks as well as the river throughout the season. In the creek, Phil and his partner hooked up with scores of fish in the one- to two-pound range throughout the day. Finally, with about a half-hour to go in the tournament, he was able to bring his winning 4.19-lb. fish to the boat.

While Phil is still hoping to capture an elusive shad in next year's tournament, a slow start to the season didn't hamper him too much this year. "Ironically, I hadn't earned that many points in the early part of the year," Phil recalls, "but when I scored in the July largemouth tournament, my fishing partner, Rick Clark, encouraged me to 'go for it'."

Height Differences: For most stations, use of a predicted height difference would give unsatisfactory predictions. In such cases they have been omitted and one or two ratios, indicated by an asterisk (*), are given. To obtain the height of tide at the subordinate station in these cases, multiply the height of tide at the reference station by the ratio listed. The result is normally rounded to the nearest .1 foot.
