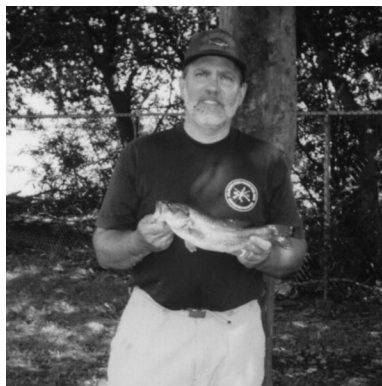
Galinat Captures Largemouth Tournament; Raulfs Maintains AOTY Lead

After a week of high, muddy waters and several days of rain, 25 DRFA anglers were greeted by relatively better weather and water conditions at the Frankford Arsenal Ramp on the morning of September 14. Unfortunately, the fishing conditions didn't quite match the rebounding weather, and only 10 anglers were able to bring a legal-size fish to the weigh-in.

First place went to Bruce Galinat who weighed in a 15.25", 1.89-lb. fish caught on a black spinnerbait. Just behind him in second place was Ed Evans with a 15.5" fish weighing 1.70 lbs. that was taken on a crankbait. Third place went to Pete Antoniewicz for his 14.25" fish weighing 1.42 lbs. that fell for a watermelon colored tube.

Calling All Youth Anglers For The DRFA Youth Fishing Tournament

Since the DRFA Youth Tournament originally scheduled for September 20 was knocked out by high, muddy waters and the remnants of Hurricane Isabel, young family, friends, and neighbors of DRFA members will get a second chance to fish in a special youth tournament to be held Saturday October 4 at the Byram New Jersey Access Ramp, (located on Route 29 just north of Bulls Island State Park). The rain date for that event will be Sunday October 5.

Since this is our first youth tournament in recent memory, we are patterning it after our regular DRFA events. The event is open to the youth guests of DRFA members. The youth anglers do not need to be DRFA members. DRFA adult members are not included as part of the competition, however if they do choose to fish during the competition, they are encouraged to keep the youth competitors as

their primary focus of attention.

The event will be held from 8:00 am until 12:30 pm. All competitors who do not register in advance must be registered before the 8:00 am start. Contestants must be back at the ramp before the 12:30 pm deadline to be eligible for the weigh-in. All fish must be alive to be weighed in for points. Both live bait and artificial lures are permitted. Only legal fishing methods for the state of PA and NJ are permitted. All contestants must wear Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Devices during the entire competition.

There will be three categories of fish: bass (*largemouth or smallmouth*) catfish, and panfish/other. Fish must be of legal size to be entered (*i.e. 12" for bass*). There will be two divisions of competitors: Senior and Junior, with the total number of entrants being divided approximately in half by age grouping. (*For example, Senior Division 15 and under, Junior Division perhaps 11 and under.*)

Fish must be caught and landed by the youth competitors to be eligible. Adults can assist in netting, but should not take the pole from the youth competitor.

Each competitor is allowed to enter their largest fish in each of the three species categories. Every competitor will receive a citation for their legally entered fish in each category. Trophies will be awarded to the top finisher for each age group (*maximum one trophy per competitor in this area*):

Senior Bass Award
Senior Catfish Award
Senior Panfish Award

Junior Bass Award
Junior Catfish Award
Junior Panfish Award

We will also present a top finisher award in each division for cumulative finishes of their three eligible species.

All competitors and DRFA members are invited to stay for hot dogs, sodas, and snacks at the end of the competition.

All DRFA members interested in bringing a contestant to this event, please contact Pete Antoniewicz at 609-466-7719, no later than Wednesday October 2nd, so that we can have personalized awards and an appropriate quantity of refreshments on hand. (Late entries cannot be guaranteed to receive personalized awards.)

kind of fishing. I had plans to get out on Tuesday or Wednesday to either the upper Delaware or Susquehanna rivers. Well on Tuesday the Delaware was still 4 feet higher and very muddy and the Susquehanna was still 6 feet and very discolored. On Wednesday things did not change much so we gave up for another week. I guess I should be thinking of hitting a lake soon. I even called up the campground out west and was told not to come out till at least the weekend. And next week is my 20th anniversary so you know I will not be getting out next week. I know the rivers will be perfect for those couple of days.

“The lower river has been very, very muddy all week. It has killed the largemouth bass fishing as we know it. These bass should be

starting to work on the bait fish moving down the river but with the color of the river I did not hear of anyone fishing for largemouth. The catfishing was very good this week on bloodworms, nightcrawlers, chicken livers, shrimp and bagels. And there were several carp taken up and down the river on corn, bagels and carp bait. Some of these carp were up to 25 pounds. There are tons of small stripers all over this river but most of these fish are from 4 to 12 inches. They are not hard to find in the early part of the day with them working over the small schools of shad and herring coming down river. During the day hours these fish seem to be hanging on sand bars and around the bridges. Bloodworms are the best bait but these fish will also hit small kastmasters, white and

chartreuse twister tails and sassy shads and small rattle traps.

“Now the lake fishing this week seemed to be the way to go. Nockamixon was a very good place this week with several guys coming back all with good reports. I weighed in a 12 pound hybrid striper caught on a leech at night. This customer had two more big hybrids and a couple of big walleyes bust his line the same night. He went back up again the next night with some fresh line. He caught all these fish on a jig head tipped with a live leech. Another customer went up Monday morning before day break and fished along the shore line to the dam and before 10 in the morning had over 30 fish. He had a mix of largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, crappies, bluegills, pickerel and even one hybrid striper. He was using plastic worms, rattle traps, white spinnerbaits and live minnows. He said that nothing was anything to brag about but all were decent fish. Jim was up on Tuesday night fishing for stripers and by the end of the night he had 6 stripers and 2 largemouth bass. He caught all his fish on small herring that he netted on the lake. And if you are looking for a close place, the shopping center lake at 413 and 13 was a great place to head this past week. One customer fished up there several days this week and each day had over 15 mixed fish. He was using minnows and nightcrawlers. And one customer was up the next lake in Fairless Hills and had two largemouth bass over 3 pounds caught on plastic worms early in the morning. I had one other customer fish off the shore line a couple of mornings and do well on largemouth bass using spinnerbaits and crankbaits. Each morning he had between 3 and 6 fish. Again nothing of great size but all nice 3 pound fish.

Another lake that produced some bass was Rohm Haas. These bass have been hitting plastic worms and rattle traps. Here some bigger fish are coming in up to 6 pounds. But the numbers are not as good. Churchville was only good for smaller crappies and perch fishing under the bridge with minnows, mealworms and small jigs.

“Even though the rivers have been very high and muddy the streams have been just on the high side. Each day after the rain the streams get much better than the rivers. The Neshaminy, Perkiomen, Tohickon and Pennypack were all pretty good for smallies from Tuesday on. I did not hear of any really great catches but plenty of fish were caught on minnows, leeches and grubs. One customer was up above Core Creek on the Neshaminy landing over 20 smallies and at least that many bluegills and rock bass. Most of his fish were taken on minnows and grubs. One other customer was out in the Perkiomen and had a great day on small bass and bluegills. He was using minnows and leeches.”

Trenton/Yardley/Lambertville Area:

Dan Leach at **HL Bait & Tackle** in Morrisville, Pennsylvania (215-295-1400) says that with the river going up and down from heavy rains, very few anglers have been reporting on the river in his area. Other than catfish being caught in the tidal river, most of the local action has been concentrated on the lakes in the Lower Bucks area.

Ron Ernst at **Ron's Trigger and Reel** in Ewing, New Jersey (609-695-2818) reported that results from a local weekend smallmouth tournament showed some bigger fish (up to 17") being caught, but not a great quantity of fish. The river was just starting to settle down from its high level of a week ago. One thing that Ron does note, however, is that the Fall season could be a relatively short one if the water temperatures dropped by recent rains continue to decline quickly. He advises anglers to take advantage of any clearing trend in water conditions, and get their smallmouth fishing in before the water temperatures drop below the 60°F mark.

Height Differences: For most stations, use of a predicted height difference would give unsatisfactory predictions. In such cases they have been omitted and one or two ratios, indicated by an asterisk (*), are given. To obtain the height of tide at the subordinate station in these cases, multiply the height of tide at the reference station by the ratio listed. The result is normally rounded to the nearest .1 foot.

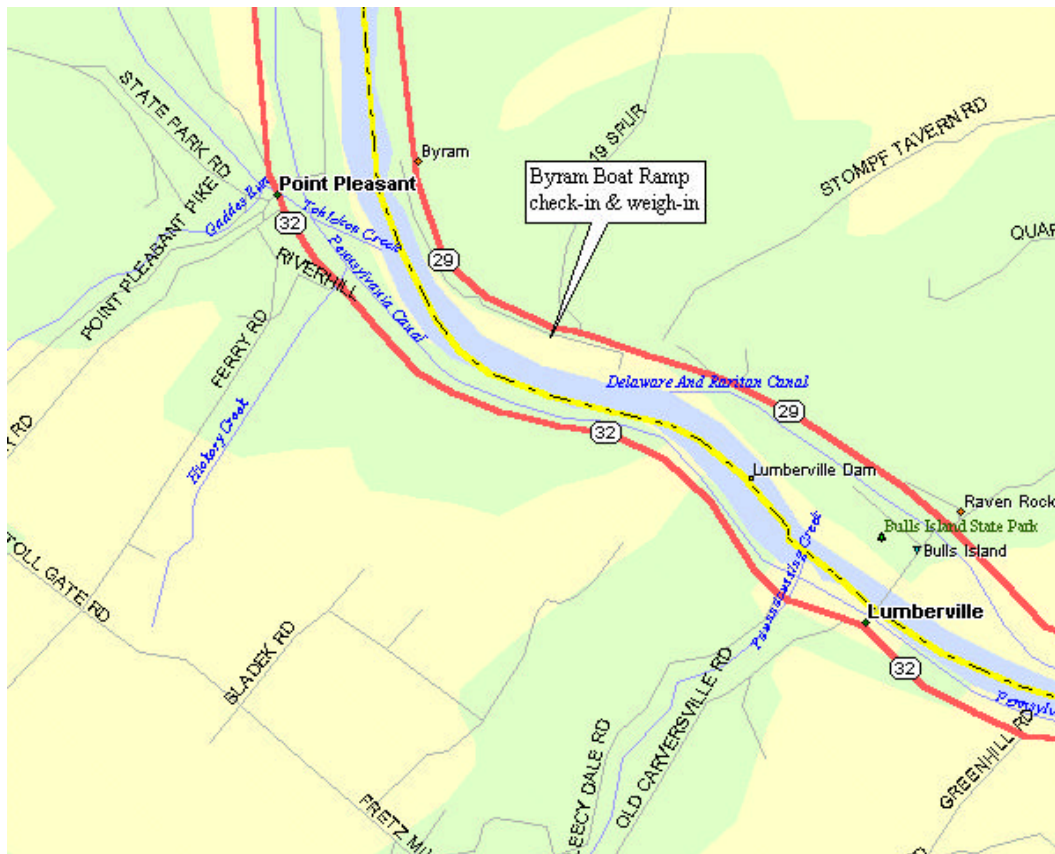
