Big Cat Shootout Results

Fifty-two boats registered for the Big Cat Shootout Tournament and 51 boats showed up for the boat check. One boat did not show due to a breakdown. Of the 51 boats that participated in the tournament, 41 boats weighed in fish. One boat returned but did not weigh in a fish and nine boats simply did not return for the weigh-in.

The winning boat, captained by Anthony Fisler, weighed in three fish for a total weight of 31.6 lbs.

In second place was Bill Suplee in boat number 46 with a three-fish total of 29.6 lbs.

Third place went to boat number 45, captained by James J. Perrone, with a weight of 26.8 lbs for three fish.

Fourth place went to Richard Callahan in boat number 23 with a three-fish total of 25.4 lbs.

The winner of the lunker pool was second place winner Bill Suplee with a 13.2 pound fish.

The winner of the Boat US Prize money was fourth place winner Richard Callahan.

Fishing Reports

This listing is an abridged from a report posted on Friday May 14, on the Web site of Brinkman's Bait and Tackle in Northeast Phila. (215-632-0674)

Tidal River

I was able to get out both days this week and had a different week of striper fishing. Last year we were just knocking the fish dead pretty much all day long. This year we have been catching fish but have to move several different times to catch a couple fish each time. And so far all this year we have been dealing with a lot of small little bites with no hook ups and this week we had over 15 good fish hooks with fights from 5 to 20 seconds and then the fish just shakes the hook. I can take all of the smaller bites to be eels but the run off have been hard hits with no fish. On Tuesday we headed to Trenton early and fished for herring. The bite here was also a little different. The first hour of fishing there were no more than 20 herring caught between the 10 boats fishing, but the last couple hours the fish picked up and we were able to get our 70 fish limit. I headed right up above the bridges and made one quick anchor to find the current so strong it was hard to keep the baits in the water. Therefore, we decided to make a couple drifts to see what we could do. The water was low but running quite fast. The first drift only took a couple minutes to get back to the bridges. Not wanting to bust my motor up we headed back down to Linden Avenue. Here we fished for 5 hours to land seven strippers, 10 catfish and a couple of eels. The biggest striper Helen caught was 38 inches about 25 pounds, a real nice fat fish. We also caught three slot fish and three fish just above the limit. Three of the catfish were 6 to 10 pounds.

On Tuesday, John and I headed out to fish around the Rancocas. The first time we anchored, we put two slot fish right in the live well and then the bite went dry. Therefore, we started the moving process and picked up a couple fish here and there. By the end of the day, we had 6 strippers, 10 catfish and 2 eels. The biggest striper was 28 inches with three slot fish.

Now I am not the only one catching strippers. Kenny was out each day this past week. Each day he has been running to Trenton for bait and then coming back, he stops at different spots to fish. On Monday, he picked up over 30 bass up to 40 inches. Tuesday he caught 20 or so fish up to the mid 30 inch. Wednesday he only caught 15 fish and most of these fish were all less than 30 inches. Jim has been out each day and has had some good luck. Monday he picked up eight fish and all the fish were 24 to mid 30 inches. Tuesday he caught six fish up to 30 inches. Both these people fished until dark and both said as night came in so did the eels. Jim had them holding the bait right up to the boat before letting go. Both these people were fishing herring.

Jack was down fishing below the Tacony Bridge on Sunday picking up 24 strippers, 9 catfish and all

kinds of white perch. He was fishing with bloodworms, clams and herring. Most all the strippers came on herring and clams with the perch just tearing up the bloodworms.

Non-tidal

Now the upper river has really turned on for smallies. Several people are starting to fish the rivers and streams. A few people were up to Bull's Island fishing with live minnows, nightcrawlers and grubs catching plenty of 12 to 15 inch smallies. The have been doing best in the deeper water below the walk bridge. One customer was up fishing the Rte 29 wall at Byram on Sunday catching 17 smallmouth bass, 2 strippers and 1 walleye. All the fish were caught on live minnows. He said the smallies were all decent size. The walleye was 21 inches and both strippers were 13 inches. One customer was up to the water gap looking for shad. He did pick a few shad up fishing the evening with shad spoons. But during the day he found the smallmouth bass fishing much better. He was fishing with grubs, Rapala's, spinner baits, spinners and shiners. He fished both Saturday and Sunday catching over 60 bass between the 2 days. He said most of the fish were 10 to 14 inches.

Dan Leach at **H & L Bait and Tackle** in Morrisville, Pa. (215-295-1400) reports that the striper and herring fishing in the Trenton is on the upswing. Smallmouth fishing is picking up north of Trenton although the recent rains have slowed the fishing considerably.

Washington Crossing/New Hope

Tom at **Tom's Tackle Shop** in Wrightstown, Pa (215-598-9891) reports stripers being caught on plugs north of Trenton early in the morning and late afternoon and in the evening. Smallmouth being caught on spinners, senkos and rattle traps. Trout and smallmouth action in Neshaminy Creek.

Robbins Ponds is giving up crappies and largemouth bass.

Easton/Phillipsburg Area

Bill Pierce at **Bill's Bait and Tackle** in Phillipsburg, NJ (908-859-5729) reports the fishing was very good before the rain.

Water Temperatures are in the low 60 degrees in both the tidal and non-tidal river. As of this printing, the river is running high and muddy.

IMPORTANT: REMEMBER TO BRING \$15 IN REASONABLY CRISP, CLEAN BILLS FOR AUTOMATIC PARKING TOLL BOOTH. THERE IS NO PARKING ON LOCAL STREETS.

Directions: Take Interstate 295 to exit 23 (*National Park*). Exit right onto Route 642/Hessian Avenue westbound. Go .5 miles to the first traffic light. Turn right onto Red Bank Avenue. Go 0.9 miles, almost to the end of Red Bank Avenue at the river. Turn left onto 2nd Street. (*There is a small sign on the right side of the road indicating left hand turn for "boat ramp"*). Go one block to Donop Street and turn right. The ramp is straight ahead. Ramp gate opens at 6:00 am.

The DRFA STRONGLY SUGGEST that all participants wear a PFD while their boat is under power.

RULES:

- All participants must check in during the hour preceding start time.
- There is no entry fee.

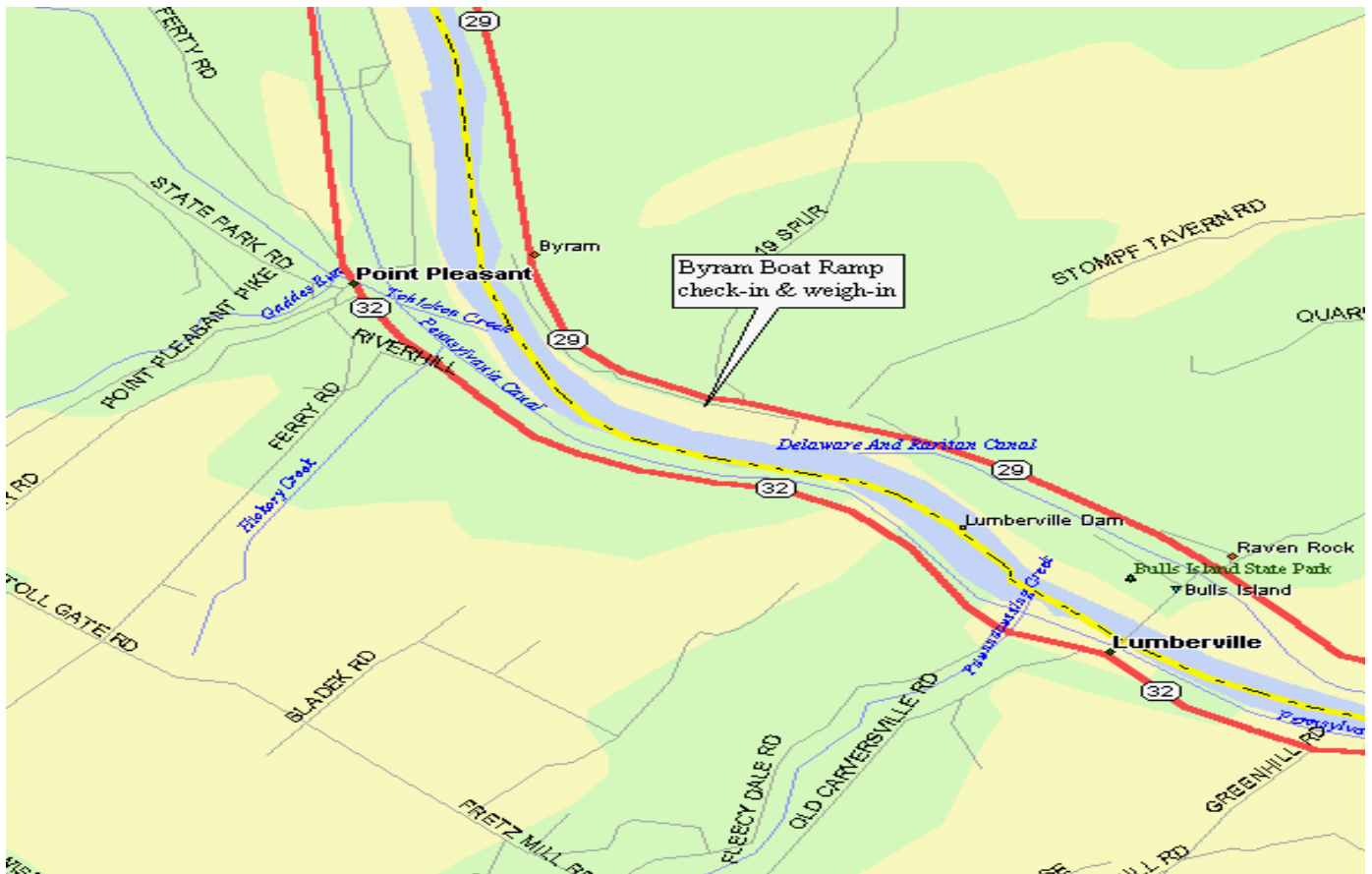

There is no entry fee; however, all participants must register in advance of the tournament.

(No application will be accepted after June 6th, 2009)

Youth anglers 3 yrs of age to 15 yrs of age who are guests of any dues-paying DRFA member are eligible.

All participants must check in between 7:00 AM & 8:00 AM at the Snug Harbor Ramp before fishing.

Youth anglers are allowed to weigh in one fish of any species.

The heaviest fish will determine the winner. In the event of a tie in weight, the longest fish will be the tie-breaker.

The fish must be caught on that day, during the hours of the tournament.

Fishing can be done from a boat or the shoreline in any part of the Delaware River and its tributaries that can be reached by boat from the Snug Harbor Ramp.

All youth contestants must wear Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Devices at all times they are in a boat during this tournament. Sponsoring adults may aid the youth contestants in terms of baiting hooks, netting, and unhooking fish, but they may not hook, play, reel, or land fish for the youth contestants.

Only legal fishing methods of the States of New Jersey and Pennsylvania may be used.

Live bait is permitted.

Weigh-in is at 1:00 pm sharp. Those arriving after 1:00 pm will not be permitted to weigh-in fish for prizes. All fish must be of legal size and alive at weigh-in, and will be released after weigh-in.

The tournament judge will have final say in all disputes.

All youth participants will receive awards, and refreshments at the weigh-in location at the end of the tournament.

Directions to Sign-In and Weigh-in:

By boat: go up Neshaminy Creek past the first bridge (at State Road). Snug Harbor Marina is around the bend on the right hand side.

By car: exit from I-95 North or South at the Street Road exit (PA Route 132) and follow Street Road east to the traffic light at State Road. Turn left on State Road and follow it north Cross the State Road Bridge over the Neshaminy Creek, and turn left at the next traffic light, onto Cedar Avenue. Take Cedar Avenue to the second street on the left and turn left onto Main Avenue there (at sign for Snug Harbor Marina).

Follow to end of road, into marina.

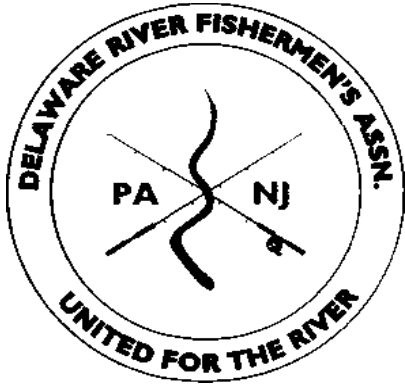
