Summer Activities: Tournaments, Fundraising, And Fishing Trips

Check Out These Chances To Participate In DRFA Club Support And Fishing Fun

The month of August offers multiple opportunities to get involved in extra-curricular and Club activities that can provide more value for your DRFA membership.

Tournaments: For starters, we have two regular Club Tournaments in August – an August 10 Bass Tournament on the tidal river (*at Gloucester City Marina*) and an August 24 Catfish Tournament (*Falls Township Quaker Penn Park Boat Ramp, 300 Pennsbury Memorial Road, Morrisville, PA*).

Each tournament offers chances to win cash prizes for the top three finishers at no added cost, because tournament participation is already covered by your annual dues. Of course, if you would like to sweeten the pot, you can also participate in the voluntary \$10 luncheon pool at each tournament.

Minutes Of The May Meeting

Rick Mawson called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm with 22 members in attendance.

Treasury Report: Eileen Kicinski's Treasury Report showed a balance of \$7,198.99 as of the May meeting date.

Membership Report: Rick Mawson reported a total of 57 members – 30 individual

members, 18 family members, and 9 supporting business members.

Tournament Report: Results from the May Catfish Tournament were reviewed along with the Angler of the Year standings at the conclusion of that Tournament. Members were reminded of the next Tournament, a Bass Tournament on June 15 at Neshaminy Marina.

Youth Activities: The annual Youth Fishing Derby was scheduled for Saturday July 19. The registration deadline was July 1, 2025. Members were advised to contact Chick Bay (609) 744-8260 with any questions.

Old Business: No date for our proposed fundraising event at the Texas Roadhouse on Street Road had been established yet. Learn more at our June meeting.

We still have open dates for guest speakers at our September and November meetings. If any member has a contact, or a suggestion or topic to recommend, please bring it to a Club Officer or Trustee.

Saturday June 7 was the next scheduled day for volunteer service hours at Silver Lake nature Center. Anyone who volunteers is reminded to register under the DRFA name so we get credit for service hours that count toward defraying the cost of our monthly meeting space.

Environmental Report: There were no Environmental Reports.

Guest Speaker: After the business meeting, Lee Taylor of Bait Crafters spoke about a variety of baits in his company's lineup of brands – including Fitt Lures swimbaits and river darters, Stinky Balls scent balls, and the

Neko Craw from his Third Eye brand.

The 50/50 drawing for \$43 was won by John Pedrick. The meeting adjourned at 8:45 pm.

Minutes Of The June Meeting

Secretary Pete Antoniewicz called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm. The minutes from the May meeting were read and approved.

Treasury Report: Eileen Kicinski's Treasury report showed a balance of \$7,417.98 as of June 24. The June 2024 balance was \$8,355.12, a difference of \$937.14.

Membership Report: As of the June meeting, we had 30 individual members, 18 family members and 10 supporting business members, for a total of 58 members – up one family membership from the previous month.

Tournament Report: Pete Antoniewicz recapped the results from the June Bass Tournament and the Angler of the Year standings as of June. He also reminded members of the upcoming Catfish Tournament at Neshaminy Marina on Saturday July 12. Rick Gasper volunteered to be the weighmaster for the August 10 Bass Tournament at Gloucester City.

Youth Activities: Members were reminded that registration for the July 19 Youth Fishing Derby at the Pennsylvania Yacht Club was due on July 1. Rick Mawson was to send an email reminder to all members asking for participants and volunteers.

Old Business: John Pedrick will approach the Texas Roadhouse with potential fundraiser dates of August 6th, 13th, and 20th.

Pete Antoniewicz will contact Bob Slobodian about openings for his Atlantic Highlands charter boat trip and post the opportunities in the July newsletter.

Rich Mawson has not had any feedback about specific projects or dates for Silver Lake Nature Center volunteer service activities.

New Business: There were no new business topics raised.

Environmental Reports: There were no new environmental reports.

Fishing Reports: Rick Mawson reported some nice success at Falls Township Lake, with 9- to 15-fish days including many bass between 1.5 and 2.5 lbs. The best was a 4-lb. 12-oz. fish caught by Rick's grandson.

Jason Johnson reported success at a number of venues – bass in Falls Township Lake, stripers and smallmouth in the river, and bass in Silver Lake, mostly on paddle-tail swimbaits. He also reported catching catfish in the river.

Rick Gasper reported a 5-lb., 7-oz. smallmouth on his first cast during a trip to the St. Lawrence River. Fortunately, it did not jinx him from catching a bunch of other fish while there.

Frank Beck and Joe Newton fished Falls Township Lake, catching 10 bass. On the way in, Joe tossed out a jerkbait and caught a 14" crappie.

Dave Wermuth reported on a group of guys getting chased off the Upper Delaware River during a trout outing due to poor water conditions. But they salvaged the trip by moving to the Beaverville, where they all did well on the trout there. Dave said that all the reservoirs in upstate NY were over 100% capacity at that point.

Pete Antoniewicz reported on getting skunked while fishing for snakeheads in the Salem River, but another angler in his party did manage a 16" and a 17" largemouth.

The 50/50 drawing for \$33 was won by Dave Wermuth. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 pm.

Bait Crafters Representative Highlights Differences In Popular Bait Styles

At the May meeting, Lee Taylor from [Bait Crafters](#) presented some of the new and different features of baits from several of his brand lines – [Fitt Lures](#), [Stinky Balls](#), [Third Eye](#), and [No Live Bait Needed](#).

A key feature across several of his bait lines is the water-

activated release of encapsulated live-bait scents, initially developed for his [Stinky Balls](#) products. Another is UV reflectivity being incorporated into both the Stinky Ball and swimbait products as a result of manufacturing development expertise gained from the scent-ball production. That UV reflectivity is designed to help in stained water.

Water-activated scent balls, containing actual ground-down worms, crawfish, or baitfish – depending on the application or scent formulation – are part of the [Stinky Balls](#) product line. Each water-soluble, biodegradable ball is designed to release scent for 20-25 minutes. The same scent technology is incorporated into his [No Live Bait Needed](#) line for saltwater and now in his [Fitt Lures](#) swimbaits for freshwater.

2025 Tournament Schedule

All DRFA Club tournaments are free and open to dues-paying DRFA members, with club-funded payouts of \$50, \$30, and \$20 awarded to the top three places. Participants also accrue points for the Angler of the Year competition based on their top six finishes among the nine regular Club events. (There are no tournament entry fees, however, ramp, launch, and/or parking fees may apply.)

Except for the Shad Tournament, there is also a voluntary \$10.00 luncheon pool with a 100% payout to pool participants for the three heaviest pool fish – 60%, 30%, and 10% – at tournament's end.

Except for the Shad Tournament, new members may register on the morning of an event before check-in time. All participants should check in at least 10 minutes before scheduled starting time. Weigh-in is at the time specified. Late entries will not count.

Always check the DRFA website or the Tournament Hotline (267-809-4098) the night before the event to learn about potential rescheduling or relocation due to weather or water conditions.

In a related note, Lee described how stringing a smaller crappie-sized Stinky Ball up to the head of a Ned Rig hook, before installing the plastic bait, can create the illusion of an “eyeball” on the bait, thanks to the UV reflectivity.

Anticipated future developments for the scent-based product line includes a gel-based product that can be applied to an individual lure and what Lee described as ‘trigger dust’ – a dehydrated powder version that can be sprinkled into a bag of soft plastics and shaken to distribute the scent across the individual lures.

Another unique product Lee displayed was his [Neko Craw](#) which enables the imitation crawfish to swim backwards, [as this video available on the bottom of the product page shows](#), just like a real crawfish trying to escape.

When discussion turned to swimbaits, Lee handed out samples of his flexible, yet durable swimbait and jerkbait material designed to compete with the average angler’s experiences with other flexible, but less durable popular brands. Also, the Fitt Lures paddle tail swimbait has a very tight tail action which some fishermen swear by as a productive technique. Lee also demonstrated his ‘color-shift’ technology available in the “Reign” color version of his *NOTTAFLUKE* soft jerkbait (*familiar to former Winco Lure customers as the River Darter*). The surface appears to have a different sheen – e.g., grayish, purplish, greenish – when viewed from different angles.

Angler Of The Year Competition Holds Lots Of Potential Volatility For Future Standings

At the half-way mark of the 2025 Dave Bryant Angler of the Year competition, both the 50-point participation bonus and the variability of angler finishes in tournament by tournament results has created a high potential for reshuffling the standings over the last four tournaments.

The top ten places feature a lot of familiar names, but the point totals are all over the lot based on missed tournaments, poor results, or even an occasional skunking. The key to the finish will be catching as many fish as possible in hopes of dropping the lowest scores to date. *(Remember, only the top six scores count toward an angler's final totals.)*

Keep 'Em Honest!
With four events left, you still have plenty of chances to impact the final standings – simply by participating in those remaining tournaments!

Even anglers with currently low standings can impact the top finishers when they all participate and some of them weigh in high-scoring fish – enough to whittle a few points off the scores of anglers in the top of the standings who might weigh in smaller fish.

In past years, some AOTY contestants (*not winners*) have coasted to the finish with small fish because lack of participation allowed them to score 90+ points even with low-ranking entries in poorly attended tournaments.

Currently, George Hoffman holds a solid lead with high finishes in most of the tournaments to date.

But second-place holder Dave Wermuth will need to watch over his shoulder as people with only three or four fish weighed-in to date could surpass him if he falters in any one event or if they more than six fish.

Another example is how defending Angler of the Year

Scott McDonough sits in fourth place but can easily overtake the lead once he gets his sixth fish, providing he finishes close to George Hoffman in the remaining events. Even the race for third place easily extends all the way down to at least the current top ten spots.
